News » Initial plans changing for RiverHeath

The initial plans for the RiverHeath project along the Fox River in Appleton are changing a bit.

Because of the economic conditions, developers are adding seven townhomes, and scaling back the scope of the first residential and commercial buildings. The multi-family project will have 26 units, instead of 56, and the commercial and retail space will total 7,000 square feet, instead of 18,000.

Ald. Jim Clemons is the chair of the community and economic development committee, and he says it's good that they're getting started.

Clemons says the changes wouldn't impact the city's deal for tax incremental financing.

The RiverHeath development is below the College Avenue bridge, on the site of a former paper mill and a Kaukauna Utilities hydro-electric plant.

Last year, crews got the site ready for construction.

The value of the initial phase of the multi-year project will total \$7.7 million.
